CWC Committee Reports

Philanthropy Committee ~ Annual Giving by Robin Winfield, Chairperson The Carmel Woman's Club provides grants to Monterey County non-profit organizations with a Carmel Community focus. We have five key priorities: Women, Seniors, Youth, Arts and Community Outreach Services. Beginning in 2006 the CWC began an annual gifting of financial help to local groups by determining where the greatest impact might be made. In 2006 we raised \$4,700, this year we have given well over twice that amount- \$11,400! Thank you to all for helping raise these funds.

Using our carefully written grant giving guidelines, the CWC Philanthropy Committee reviews all applications and then recommends a slate of grants once a year to the CWC board to give final approval. This year we have chosen 14 organizations to receive grants.

We granted \$600 each to the following: Alliance on Aging, Blind and Visually Impaired Center of Monterey County, Breast Cancer Assistance Group, Carl Cherry Center for the Arts, Carmel Foundation, Carmel Valley Angel Project, Chamber Music Monterey Bay, Gathering for Women, Kernes Adaptive Aquatics, Monterey Sober Living for Women, Pacific Repertory Theatre, Salvation Army, Sun Street Centers and VNA & Hospice.

If you know a deserving group you may always suggest they apply for next year (applications due 9/30/24).


Financial Report ~ Tina DeMaria, Treasurer

INGREDIENTS

1 cup all-purpose flour

½ tsp baking soda

1/4 tsp baking powder

1/2 tsp fine sea salt

½ tsp ground cinnamon

½ cup salted butter (softened)

½ cup granulated sugar

½ cup light brown sugar (pack it in)

1 egg

1 tsp pure vanilla extract

1 ½ cup old fashioned oats

1 cup mix-ins... now here is where I created a new flavor.

*You can always add chocolate chips and nuts but this time I chopped up a ½ cup of dried apple slices, a ¼ cup of golden raisins and then added about ½ cup of Trader Joe's Caramel Sea Salt Baking Chips! **Yum!!**

I always double or triple a recipe because you can never have too many cookies! They freeze well too!

Oatmeal Apple Caramel Clusters

A recipe from Lendy's kitchen

DIRECTIONS

- Pre-heat oven to 375
- Line baking sheets with parchment paper
- In a small bowl, combine flour, baking soda, baking powder, salt and cinnamon. Set aside.
- Place butter and sugars in your stand mixer and beat until combined.
- Add egg and vanilla and beat on medium speed until the mixture is light
- Add dry ingredients and beat until just combined.
- Add oatmeal, raisins, dried apples, and caramel chips (if you like nuts you can add them too!)
- Use a 2 tablespoons cookie scoop to measure out the dough
- Roll the dough into a ball and place on cookie sheet about 2 inches apart
- Gently and very slightly press down the top of the cookies until they are flat.
- Bake in pre-heated oven for 8-10 minutes until the top is set and the edges are golden
- Let sit on baking pan for 5 minutes before transferring to wire rack.

I then melted ¼ cup of the Caramel Chip in a zip lock bag, cut off the tip and drizzled the melted sea salt chips over the cookies. Topped them all off with a pinch of flaky salt. **ENJOY!!!**
